
The Bus Station

Then the bus went into the train station, where ten people got off and 12 more got on. The bus drove out of the station, turned left and went straight on to the end of the road.

1 Yesterday morning six people got on at the bus station: two men, one woman and three children.




2 The bus had to stop at the corner because the traffic lights were red.
