'The Great Blue Norther' Day

Sometimes, you wake (1) _____ on a nice, warm morning, put on a T-shirt and go to school. Then, when you are at school, you start to see clouds and when it is time to go home it is raining. You get home cold and wet and your parents ask why you didn't take a coat. It's an easy mistake to make.

You are lucky you weren't in the Midwest of the USA (2) _____ 11 November 1911. It was a beautiful autumn day. The temperature went up and up and, in Oklahoma City in the afternoon, it was 28°C. That was the highest temperature ever at that time of year. It was a Saturday, so a (3) _____ of people went out to enjoy the sun. Some of them were wearing just a T-shirt and trousers. Maybe some were wearing shorts.

Suddenly, (4) _____ the middle of the afternoon, the weather changed. There were cold, blue-grey clouds in the sky and a strong wind came from the north. People

called the weather 'the Great Blue Norther'. Many towns had big changes in temperature, but the people of Springfield, Missouri, probably had the worst day. At 3:45 pm it was 27°C. Fifteen minutes later, it was just 4°C. What (5) _____ you do if you were outside with friends and the weather changed so suddenly?

By midnight, the temperature was -11°C. During the day, in towns like Oklahoma City and Springfield, there were the highest temperatures ever and that night was the (6) _____ November night in the same places. The next day, in many places, there was a lot of snow on the ground.

This area of the USA often gets strange weather. Cold winds can come down from Canada, hot weather can come up from Mexico. But, Saturday, 11 November 1911, was the strangest day of all and people still (7) _____ about it now, over one hundred years later.
