NOTES:

malaria: / məˈleəriə \$ -ler- / noun [uncountable] a disease that is common in hot countries and that you get when a type of mosquito bites you — malarial adjective: malarial fever.

wreak / rik / verb 1 wreak havoc/mayhem/destruction (on something) to cause a lot of damage or problems : These policies have **wreaked havoc** on the British economy.
