Present real conditional

The present real conditional is used to express true, factual ideas. The (if clause) indicates condition, and the result clause indicates the result or what happens if the condition is met.

Use the simple present in the (if clause) and the (result clause).

If you aren't sure about the result, you can use a modal, such as can, might, or must in the result clause.

Use a comma between the (if clause) and the (main clause) **only** if the sentence begins with the (if clause).
