

PERSONAL PRONOUNS

Personal pronouns stand for the persons.

1. 'I' and 'we' tell about the person/persons speaking. They are called personal pronouns of first person. 'I' is singular but 'we' is plural.
2. The pronoun 'you' tells about the person/persons spoken to. 'You' is the personal pronoun of second person. 'You' is always plural.
3. The pronouns which tell about the person/persons spoken are personal pronouns of third person.

Example:

He, She, It and They.

He, She, It are singulars but 'They' is plural.
