E.g. Ali is athletic **whereas** his brother Garfield is obese.

3. He is careful. I take risks (Whereas)

4. The weather was snowy. It was not cold. (Yet)

5. Chicken meat is white. Cow's meat is red. (Whereas)

6. Miss Havisham was filthy rich. She wasn't happy. (However)

E.g Tom died **as an result** of an accident.

1. John cheated. John failed his exam. (as an result)

E.g John was caught cheating. **Therefore**, he was punished.

2. John eats like a glutton. John is obese. (Therefore)

E.g **Due to** the bad weather, we did not go swimming.

3. There was a terrible traffic jam. We became late. (Due to)

E.g Tom copied from his friend. **Consequently**, he was punished.

4. He didn't wake up early. He was late to work. (Consequently)

E.g There was nothing to do, so I played video games

5. There was nothing in the fridge. I ordered a pizza (So)

E.g The dog played in the mud and **thus** will need a bath tonight.

6. She did well in high school. She will get into a good college. (Thus)

E.g At high altitude, the boiling point of water is lower than at sea-level. Thus, pasta takes longer time to cook.

7. They finally found the robber. The problem was solved. (Thus)
