5. She carried the hot beverages on a tray. She did not want to cause a spill.  
(so as not to)



E.g He turned down the music **so that** he wouldn't disturb the neighbours.

(so that)

1. You will fail. You have to study. (if)

E.g Take your umbrella **in case** it rains.

2. Take a map with you. You may become lost. (in case)

E.g I don't know **whether** to stand or sit.

3. I don't know if I should go. I don't know if I should stay. (whether)

E.g You won't know **unless** you go.

4. You have to try. Or you won't win (unless)
