Estas dos palabras significan lo mismo: UN o UNA. Sin embargo, hay una diferencia en su uso:

a + consonante

Usamos A antes de una palabra que comience con una consonante. Ejemplos:

- » I need a favor
(Necesito un favor)
- » I have a lamp
(Tengo una lámpara)

an + vocal

Usamos AN antes de una palabra que comience con una vocal. Ejemplos:

- » I bought an apple
(Compré una manzana)
- » I ate an egg
(Comí un huevo)

Excepciones



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- » Cuando el sonido de la H es mudo:
an hour (una hora) an honor (un honor)
- » Cuando la vocal U es una semiconsonante:
a unicorn (un unicornio) a uniform (un uniforme)
