<p>The <i>speaker</i> thinks it is necessary.            Personal opinion.            Written rules/instructions.</p>		<p>Another <i>person</i> thinks it is necessary.            External obligation.            Facts, not opinions.</p>		
<p>The teacher is giving the students an obligation / instructions.  <b>TEACHER:</b> You <b>must</b> complete the essay by Friday.  <b>STUDENT:</b> We <b>have to</b> complete the essay by Friday.            The teacher has given us the obligation / instructions.</p>				
<p>We use <b>Had to</b> instead of <b>Must</b> in the past tense.            - I <b>had to</b> pay my speeding ticket yesterday.</p>		<p><b>Have to</b> is more common than <b>Must</b> in questions.            - When do you <b>have to</b> finish the report?</p>
