Present	Perfect v	s. Past Simple
---------	-----------	----------------

We use the present perfect to describe events that happened in the past and that are still true today. We use *have/has* + *past participle*.

I have won a silver medal, but I haven't won a gold medal.

We use the past simple to describe events that happened at a specific moment in the past.

When did you win the silver medal?

I won the silver medal last month.
