Spring Semester Courses in Sociology

Course A

Sociology of Work

The purpose of this course is to examine how work has evolved over the past 30 years and how it has been affected by radical recent changes in the U.S. economy. These changes have been so enormous that understanding the full extent of their impact on our daily lives is a challenge. They affect family life, individual life chances, and personal identity within the wider community. There have also been consequences for American culture as a whole, and the course will consider these, too.

Course B

Sociology of Language

There is such a close connection between language and society that discussing diversity in language can be almost meaningless if we do not also consider how it relates to culture. Variations in language frequently reflect social and cultural diversity. When someone does not use language in the same way as we do, do we feel prejudiced toward them? This course will introduce the linguistic diversity in the U.S., as well as look at how we respond to people who speak in different ways.

Course C

Sociology of Culture

In the field of sociology, “culture” includes areas such as how people spend their free time, what they buy, how they dress, and how they interact with the arts. In this course, we look at how our social status affects the choices we make concerning things like leisure activities, friends, and personal style. We will look at the way society influences our cultural behavior, and how we distinguish between ourselves and those we consider “different.”
