What are examples of extreme weather?

- Tornado: clouds, strong wind, rain, hail.
- Hurricane or cyclone: strong wind, heavy rain.
- Blizzard: heavy snow, ice, cold temperatures.
- Dust storm: strong winds, arid conditions.
- Flood: heavy rainfall.
- Hail storm: cold or warm temperatures, rain, ice.

HURRICANE!


Do you like storms? This man likes storms. He's flying into a hurricane with his camera.



What is a hurricane?
A hurricane is a big storm. There's a lot of wind and a lot of rain. The storm goes round in a big circle. It can knock down trees and houses. There are big waves on the sea, too.
