

PRESENT PERFECT with JUST, ALREADY & YET

Since Starting point in the past	I have had headache since last week.
for a period of time (duration)	She has lived here for five months.
just a short time ago	He has just gone out.
already before you expected	I have already read the newspaper.
yet until now (Neg/Q)	I haven't paid the bills yet .

ADVERB	MEANING	POSITION	EXAMPLE
JUST	Muy reciente-mente	In front of the verb.	She has just arrived.
ALREADY	Ya	In front of the verb.	We have already seen that film.
YET (question)	Ya	At the end of the sentence.	Have you visited your family yet ?
YET (negative)	Todavía	At the end of the sentence.	I haven't had breakfast yet .
EVER	Alguna vez	In front of the verb.	Have you ever parachuted from a plane?
NEVER	Nunca	In front of the verb.	I have never visited Japan.

PRESENT PERFECT with JUST, ALREADY & YET

The **PRESENT PERFECT** always connects the past with the present.

A. When used with “**just**” it expresses a **recently completed action**. It is placed between the auxiliary and the main verb. Ex: He **has just** left the office.

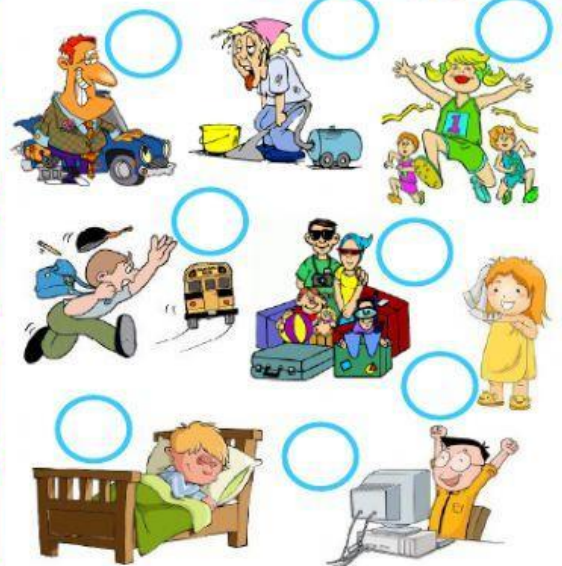

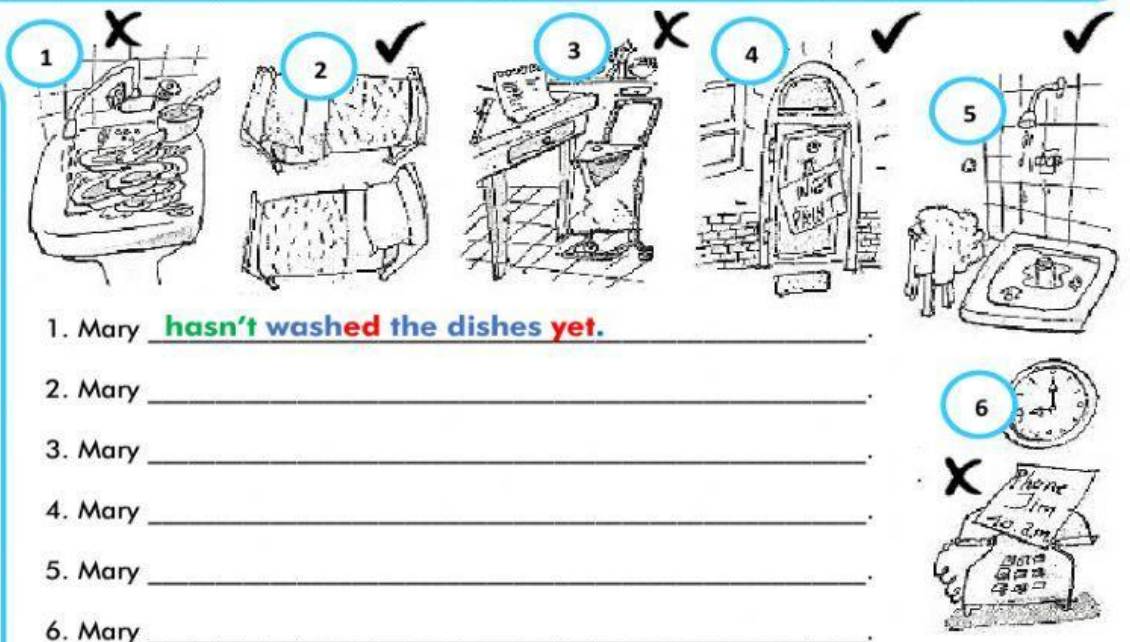
B. When used with “**already**” it describes an **action which happened before or sooner than expected**. It is placed between the auxiliary and the main verb.

C. When used with “**yet**” it describes **something that has not happened but that you expect to happen**. It is placed at the end of a negative sentence.

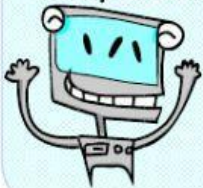
