Ryan doesn't live in a big city where there are cinemas, supermarkets, schools and libraries. Ryan lives in the outback of Australia. The 'outback' refers to enormous areas of sparsely populated land. These areas stretch over thousands of miles and your nearest neighbour might live more than four hours away! It's impossible to build schools in areas like this so children who live in the outback usually attend the School of the Air. The School of the Air began in the 1950s when children used high-frequency radios to communicate with teachers 'over the air'. Today, both radio and satellite technology is used.
