Grammar: The second conditional

If she didn't come back, he would die.

There are different ways to express a hypothetical situation in the present or future. Hypothetical situations are situations we are imagining. We use the **second conditional** to describe them.

Its structure is:

If + past simple, *would* + infinitive

Note:

- The past simple is used here to show that something is imaginary, NOT that it is in the past.
- 'if' and 'would' cannot go in the same part of the sentence. Think of the comma (,) as the dividing line between the two parts of the sentence.
