**asks a question. Must be followed by a noun or a pronoun  
which, what, whose**

**Demonstrative**

**provides the specific number or quantity of the nouns/pronouns.  
whole pizza, ten cents, two children**

**Interrogative**

**directly refers to something . always comes before the word it modifies  
this, that, these, those**
