such (a/an) (+ adj) + noun (+ that)

It was such a heavy bag that she couldn't carry it.
It was such bad weather that the trip was cancelled.
other common phrases: so much/so many/such a lot of + noun (+ that)*We had taken so much food on the picnic that we couldn't eat it all.**I had never seen such a lot of grey seals all in one place before!*

too + adj/adv (+ to infinitive)

It was too hot to do anything very active.

other common phrases: too much/too many + noun (+ to infinitive)

*There were too many people at the tourist site to appreciate it properly.**People had given the ducks too much bread and they weren't interested anymore.*

(not +) adj/adv + enough (+ to infinitive)

She couldn't swim well enough to get to the island.

(not) + enough (+ adj) + noun (+ to infinitive)


