

PAST PERFECT TENSE – Interrogative form

PAST PERFECT → PAST SIMPLE OF VERB "TO HAVE" (HAD) + THE PAST PARTICIPLE.
The past participle often ends in **-ed** or **-d** (opened, finished, decided, etc.) but many important verbs are irregular (written, done, seen, eaten, etc)

AFFIRMATIVE FORM

NEGATIVE FORM

I	} hadn't (had not)	washed
You		cleaned
He		danced
She		finished

They		begun

INTERROGATIVE FORM

	we	been?
	you	bought?
	they	begun?
