Transitive verbs

A type of action verb that DOESN'T have an object on which the action is being performed

She is painting right now.

Intransitive verbs

tells the state of mind of the subject or a relationship between the subject and the object of the sentence.

She likes coffee.

Dynamic verbs

a type of action verb that has a definite object which the action is being performed

She is painting the kitchen walls.

Stative verbs

connect the subject to a noun or adjective. (Also called "helping verbs")

She is happy to help.

Linking verbs

shows action done by the subject of the sentence.

She buys coffee every morning.
