

M&M'S

M&M's are multi-colored button-shaped chocolates, each of which has the letter "m" printed in lower case in white on one side, consisting of a candy shell surrounding a filling which varies depending upon the variety of M&M's.

The original candy has a semi-sweet chocolate filling which, upon introduction of other variations, was branded as the "plain, normal" variety.

The candy originated in the United States in 1941 and M&M's have been sold in over 100 countries since 2003. They are produced in different colors, some of which have changed over the years.

The candy-coated chocolate concept was inspired by a method used to allow soldiers in the Spanish Civil War (1936-1939) to carry chocolate in warm climates without it melting. The company's longest-lasting slogan reflects this: "Melts in your mouth, not in your hand."
