

Simple Subjects & Predicates

A sentence is a group of words that expresses a complete thought. All sentences have two parts. A subject and a predicate. The **simple subject** is the one word which tells who or what the sentence is about. A **simple predicate** is the one word that tells what the subject is or is doing. It is a verb.

Subject **predicate**

The fireman (pointed) the hose at the fire.
