

Simple past of regular verbs	
Affirmative	Negative
He hated dogs. He stopped the man. He hurried to the house.	He didn't hate cats. He didn't stop the dog. He didn't hurry to the car.
Questions	Short answers
What did the dog chase?	A cat.
Did it chase a cat?	Yes, it did. No, it didn't.

Note

To make an affirmative simple past form, we usually add -ed or -d to the base form. For some verbs, we also double the final consonant ($stop \rightarrow stopped$). For other verbs, we change y to i (hurry \rightarrow hurried).

Write in your notebook the simple past form of the verbs. Be careful with the spelling of carry, drop, reply, and stop.
