That evening at home Fay tells her dad about the competition.


Fay, let's cook together.

Fay, you've got some flour, some milk, some chocolate, and some eggs. What are you making?




Miss Tulip is tasting the food. Sally's chocolate cake is very good. And Ted's chocolate biscuits are great, too. And now it's Fay's turn.
