

## LES COULEURS SONT DES ADJECTIFS

*Colors are adjectives. In French, adjectives can change depending on the gender (masculin or féminin) of the noun they modify (describe) and if the noun is singular or plural.*

Fill in the chart below to show how colors change based on the noun they "modify".  
(White boxes = no change)

| English | Masculin | M+Plural |   | Feminin | F + Plural |
|---------|----------|----------|---|---------|------------|
| Black   | NOIR     |          |   |         |            |
| Grey    | GRIS     |          |   |         |            |
| Brown   | MARRON   |          |   |         |            |
| Brown   | BRUN     |          |   |         |            |
| Purple  | VIOLET   |          | * | *       | *          |
| Blue    | BLEU     |          |   |         |            |
| Green   | VERT     |          |   |         |            |
| Yellow  | JAUNE    |          |   |         |            |
| Orange  | ORANGE   |          |   |         |            |
| Red     | ROUGE    |          |   |         |            |
| Pink    | ROSE     |          |   |         |            |
| White   | BLANC    |          | * | *       | *          |

\*These colors are a bit different. BE CAREFUL!!!!

**Note:** Colors that share a name with a food or mineral DO NOT change.  
Which 2 colors above are examples of this?
