

LESSON **Animal Habitats**

In this lesson, you will read three texts about animals and their habitats. Then, you will answer questions and complete a task to show your understanding of the texts.

TEXT 1 **Scorpion Habitats**

Scorpions live all over the world, but mostly in dry, warm areas. Like spiders, they are **arachnids** and have eight legs. Scorpions have a pair of **poison glands** in their **stinger**; this is what they use for hunting. Scorpion poison is meant for animals so it is usually not harmful to humans.

The European yellow-tailed scorpion is found in warm European countries like Italy or Portugal. It is quite small, about 5cm, and eats insects. As global warming is causing the temperature in many countries to get warmer, **colonies** of scorpions have been found in the United Kingdom.

VOCABULARY

Arachnids: a group of animals with four pairs of legs

Poison: something that can make you sick or kill you if you eat or drink it

Glands: an organ in the body that produced a particular chemical or liquid

Stinger: a pointed part of an insect, plant, or animal that goes through a person's or animal's skin and leaves behind poison

Colonies: a group or nest of scorpions
