She suffered all day long spending her energy on cooking, mopping, cleaning and washing clothes.

Worse was to come, the owners locked her up in a tiny room when they went out. She stayed alone waiting for the day to pass. She recalled her memories with friends at school, and she wept.

As a direct result of awareness campaigns, the neighbours informed the "Child Labour Enforcement Team." She was rescued and is now placed in a girls' transit home. Who knows, how many such unreached are waiting to be rescued!
