Buying a first car is an exciting event in the lives of many young people. And before long, it may be a fully electric car. That's because in the near future many major cities are planning to ¹ away with both gasoline and diesel cars. It could happen fast, some experts say. By the year 2040, 90 percent of cars in the U.S., Canada, and Europe could be electric. And China may have as many as 60 million.

After all, cars replaced horses in a brief 10–15 years. If you had wanted a car in 1910, you might not have been able to afford one. Henry Ford's Model T cost the equivalent of \$137,000. Electric cars are still in the price range of the old Model T, but that may soon change. Lisa Farrow, a 25-year-old writer from Connecticut, bought her first electric car last year and had this to say: "If I'd bought this car sooner, I'd have more money. I wish I hadn't waited." That's because it can go as far as 180 miles on a single charge. "If only someone had told me electric cars were four-times more energy efficient," Lisa added.

Electric cars may be self-powered, too, before too long. Sending a car to pick up your groceries could be a dream that will ⁴ true in the very near future!
