It's formed with **have + verb in Past Participle**.

We use the Present Perfect to talk about:

- Unspecified time before now. **e.g.** *I have cleaned the house.*
- Experience. **e.g.** *He has never been to China.*
- Change over time. **e.g.** *She has learned English since she moved to the USA.*
- Accomplishments. **e.g.** *Men have built a space station.*
