<b><i>Uses</i></b>	When we focus on time ( since – for )	When we focus on numbers
<b><i>Forms</i></b>	Has / have + been + v ( ing)	Has / have + p.p
<b><i>example</i></b>	I have been running for one hour	I have ran three time last week
<b><i>Question</i></b>	<b>How long</b> have you been running?	<b>How many</b> times have you ran?
<b><i>negative</i></b>	I haven't been running for one hour	I haven't ran three times last week
