Imperative and Exclamatory Sentences

A **command** is a sentence that tells someone to do something. It is called an **imperative sentence**. It ends with a **period (.)**. The subject of a command is *you*, but *you* is usually not shown.

Pack your suitcase.

An **exclamation** is a sentence that shows surprise or strong feelings. It is called an **exclamatory sentence**. It ends with an **exclamation mark (!)**.

What a great trip this will be! I can't wait to go!

All commands and exclamations begin with capital letters.

Put a period at the end if the sentence is a command. Put an exclamation mark at the end if the sentence is an exclamation.

1. Bring your camera

2. Put your jacket on

3. Wow, I am so excited

4. Get in the car, please

5. Hooray, we're on our way
