

Imperative and Exclamatory Sentences

A command is a sentence that tells someone to do something. It is called an **imperative sentence**. It ends with a period (.). The subject of a command is *you*, but *you* is usually not shown.

Pack your suitcase.


An exclamation is a sentence that shows surprise or strong feelings. It is called an **exclamatory sentence**. It ends with an exclamation mark (!).

What a great trip this will be! I can't wait to go!

All commands and exclamations begin with capital letters.

Put a period at the end if the sentence is a command. Put an exclamation mark at the end if the sentence is an exclamation.

1. Bring your camera


