

ONE / ONES

We use one/ones when we do not want to repeat the already mentioned noun.

ONE (singular)	ONES (plural)
A: I've got two <u>dictionaries</u> . Which one do you want? B: I want this one . A: Which <u>bag</u> is yours? B: That one near the window. - That <u>pen</u> doesn't write. Could you give me a new one ?	- I've got a lot of <u>books</u> , but I like the horror ones most. A: Which <u>shoes</u> are yours? B: The black ones . - Those <u>clothes</u> are too old. I need some new ones .

ONE → refers to the previously mentioned SINGULAR noun

ONES → refers to the previously mentioned PLURAL noun

Examples: I don't know which skirt I liked most, the yellow one or the blue one.
I'd like to have some apples. I'd like to have the red ones, please!
