We use one/ones when we do not want to repeat the already mentioned noun.

ONE (singular)	ONES (plural)

ONE	$\rightarrow$	refers	to	the	previously	mentioned	SINGULAR noun
ONES	$\rightarrow$	refers	to	the	previously	mentioned	PLURAL noun
