Read the questions and answers below. Look at the verbs. 1st = first 3rd = third

1st person Question		What time do you usually get up on Saturday?
1 st person answer	1	I usually get up at 6 o'clock on Saturday.
3 rd person Question	2	What time does Luis usually get up on Saturday?
3 rd person answer		Luis usually gets up at 6 o'clock on Saturday.

In present simple, we add s the verb in the 3rd person.

Examples: I play - She plays / I read - He reads / I grow - It grows

Adding s - spelling rules

Most verbs add s in the 3rd person – play/plays – work/works – sleep/sleeps – love/loves

Some verbs have different rules.

Have is irregular: have - has haven't - hasn't

For verbs that end in sh – add es wash – washes wish – wishes

For verbs that end in ch – add es watch – watches catch – catches Change the verb

I cat<mark>ch</mark> a cold every winter.	Zhor a cold every winter.
I mat<mark>ch</mark> words and pictures.	Jose words and pictures.
I scrat<mark>ch</mark> an itch foot.	Lara an itchy foot.
I rea<mark>ch</mark> the top floor.	Ellie the top floor.
I stret<mark>ch</mark> before running.	She before running.
I catch the 333 bus at night.	The man the 333 bus at night.

For verbs that end in o – add es do – does go – goes

I never go on holiday.	Ali never on holiday.
I do my best to understand.	Ping her best to understand.
I go to the Mosque on Fridays.	Mo to the Mosque on Fridays.
I do my laundry on Saturday.	Deka her laundry on Saturday.
I go home very late from work.	Mila home very late from work.
I do my homework on time.	Jo her homework on time.

For verbs that end in a consonant y – change to ies cry – cries dry – dries try – tries

For verbs that end in a vowel y – add s buy – buys enjoy – enjoys
