Jenelle bought a special pair of shoes called **point shoes**. They are reinforced with **glue** and paper to protect a dancer's foot. But there was a problem: The shoes were only **available** in the traditional color. It is often called ballet pink. It's a shade of pale pink that **resembles** a dancer's **skin**—if that dancer is white. But Jenelle is African American. She's a student at Dance Theatre of Harlem (DTH). That's a ballet school and dance company in New York City for dancers of color. Traditional ballet shoes don't match the skin tone of most DTH dancers. The school asks that dancers color their point shoes to match their skin.

4. Racismo estrutural refere-se a um conjunto de práticas institucionais e relações sociais, econômicas e políticas que privilegiam um grupo étnico em detrimento de outro. São as estruturas da sociedade que promovem de maneira direta ou indireta o preconceito racial e contribuem para perpetuar as desigualdades. O fato de haver, no balé, somente sapatilhas rosas tem a ver com o pressuposto de que só pode haver bailarinos brancos. Isto é uma manifestação do racismo estrutural.

Recentemente, surgiu nos EUA um movimento que tem ganhado força ao redor do mundo e visa combater o racismo estrutural.
