Adverbs of manner

We use adverbs of manner to talk about how we do things.

*They speak Italian **badly**.*

*They arrive home **happily**.*

To make regular adverbs we add **-ly** to the adjective.

*bad – **badly***

Adjectives that end in **-y** change to **-ily**.

*happy – **happily***

Some adverbs are irregular.

*He speaks Italian **well**. (adj. good)*

*He runs **fast**. (adj. fast)*
