GARRETT A MORGAN

An accident between a car and a horse-drawn carriage turned on a green light in the mind of one (0) C to it. Why not, thought Garrett A Morgan, design a signal that would (1)___ the movement of road traffic? (2)___ a result, in February 1927 Morgan produced the world's first automatic electric traffic signal.

His invention (3)___ of a pole with two arms that turned round to indicate when traffic should move. The words 'stop' and 'go' were on different sides of the arms, which automatically turned and faced the right line of traffic when necessary.

Morgan, who had been (4)___ about road safety because of the (5)___ number of cars coming on to the roads at the time, sold his invention to the General Electric Company for \$40,000.

Morgan was born in Kentucky in 1877 and (6)___ an elementary education. In 1905 he began a job (7)___ sewing machines and in 1907 he (8)___ his own shop for this. He (9)___ on to start a company selling hair treatments and later he invented the 'safety hood', which (10)___ firemen from gas and smoke and (11)___ a prize at a 1914 exhibition.
