When you ask about life experiences using *ever*, you use the present perfect. When you want to specify the exact moment you did something, you use the past simple:

Has he **been** to South Africa?

No, he **hasn't**.

Have you ever **eaten** curry?

Yes, I **have**. I **ate** curry in India.
