Match each plague to an effect. Refer to Exodus 7:17–11:7 and the information discussed in class.

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| 1. hail | a. proved that <i>Hegt</i> , an Egyptian goddess with a frog's head, was not worthy of worship |
| 2. diseased livestock | b. showed that the Egyptian sun god, <i>Amon-Ra</i> , was not as powerful as the God of the Hebrews |
| 3. frogs | c. demonstrated that the Egyptian river gods were unable to protect the source of water, the Nile River |
| 4. lice (or gnats) | d. ate what was left of the crops, leaving nothing for people or animals, showing the powerlessness of the goddess of life, <i>Isis</i> , and the god of crops, <i>Seth</i> |
| 5. flies | e. showed the Egyptian god of medicine, <i>Imhotep</i> , and the Pharaoh's court magicians to be powerless |
| 6. boils | f. kept the Egyptians from sacrificing their livestock because the priests and the animals were infested and unclean |
| 7. darkness | g. was an insult to <i>Hathor</i> , the mother-goddess of Egypt, who was represented by a cow |
| 8. locusts | h. broke down and crushed stems of grain, showing that the goddess <i>Isis</i> and the god <i>Seth</i> were powerless |
| 9. waters become blood | i. similar to the plague of lice (gnats); spread filth and disease |
| 10. death of the firstborn | j. took the life of Pharaoh's child; proved <i>Osiris</i> , the Egyptian giver of life, to be false and powerless |
