- Things that are always true.
- Habits or things we do regularly.
- We use adverbs of frequency such as always, usually, sometimes, hardly ever, never. And time expressions such as every day, on Mondays, at the weekend, etc.
- Things that are happening at the moment of speaking.
- Temporary situations.
- We use time expressions such as: now, at the moment, at present, today, tonight, this morning/afternoon/evening, this week/month/year & while.
