antes de + infinitive

después de + infinitive

In Spanish an **infinitive** is the only form of a verb that can follow a preposition. If the verb that follows the preposition is reflexive, the reflexive pronoun must be attached to the end of the verb and must agree with the subject.

ejemplos.

Yo me ducho después de levantarme.

Susi se maquilla antes de vestirse.
