What are the three states of water?	The ocean is salty because it is a mixture of water and dissolved salts. These salts come mostly from rocks on land.
Why do we see more blue water than green land in a picture of the Earth?	Fresh water is an important resource because people need it for drinking, for cooking, for growing crops, and other activities
What are the four kinds of water bodies?	People can find fresh water in rivers, lakes and underground.
Why is fresh water an important resource?	We see more blue water than green land in a picture of Earth because almost three-fourths of Earth's surface is covered with water.
