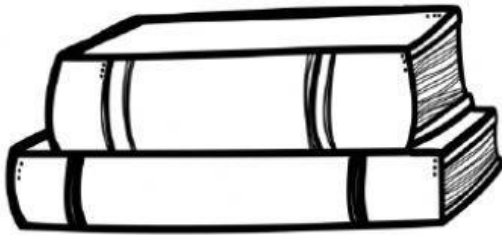

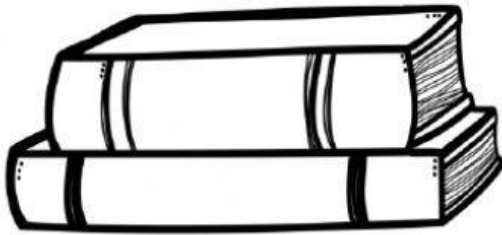

A very old story that often tells how something in the world came to be

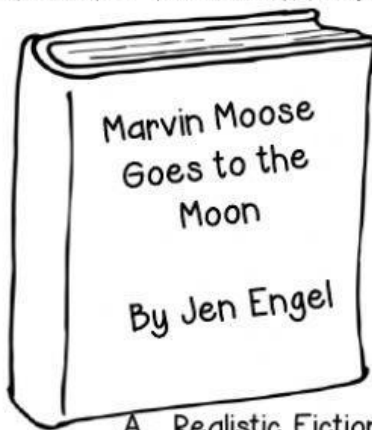

A type of folk tale based on a real person or event, but it cannot be proven

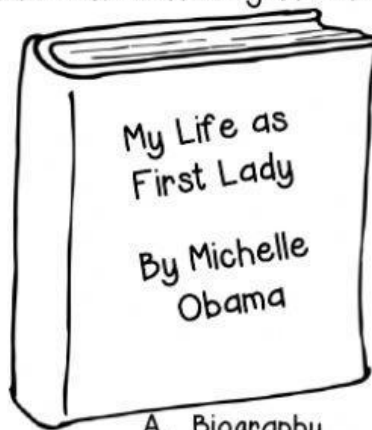

A type of fiction that includes old stories passed down from generation to generation

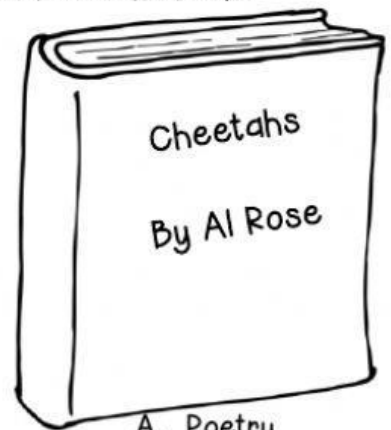
