



A **declarative sentence** makes a statement. It ends with a period (.). Examples:

1. Cells are the building blocks of all living things.
2. An plant cell is different from an animal cell because it has a cell wall and chloroplast.

An **interrogative sentence** asks a question. It ends with a question mark (?). Examples:

1. What are the building blocks of all living things?
2. How is a plant cell different from an animal cell?
