The Simple Present Tense

Remember: When talking about the daily activities or general truths about **one** person or thing, place an 's' at the end of the action word.

If the action word ends with **ch, sh, s**, **x** or **z**, add 'es' at the end of the word.

If the action word ends with **y**, change the **y** to an 'i' and add 'es'.

When talking about more than one person or thing, do not add 's' to the end of the verb.
