


Relative Pronouns

A **relative pronoun** is used to connect a clause or phrase to a noun or pronoun. The clause modifies, or describes, the noun.

A **clause** is a group of words that have a subject and a verb, but can't stand alone as a sentence.

Relative pronouns are placed directly after the noun or pronoun they modify.



Example2: This is the man. His car hit the boy.

This is the man whose car hit the boy.

#	pronoun	use	example
1	Who/that	to talk about people.	The driver who ran the stop sign was careless.
2	that	to talk about things or places.	I like the bike that my father gave me.
3	Which	to talk about things.	This is the book , which everyone is talking about.
4	whose	to talk about people's possessions.	I have a friend whose cat is annoying.
5	where	to talk about places.	I want to visit the island where my grandma was born.

*Examples:

- 1- Ahmed helped Ali **whose** room was untidy.
- 2- This is my brother (**who / that**) works in a hospital.
- 3- It is my car, **which** I use to go to my work.
- 4- The city **where** you live is beautiful.
- 5- This is the package **that** came yesterday.
