

Past Simple



Past Continuous

We often use the past simple and the past continuous together to say that something happened in the middle of something else:



I (WAIT) at the bus stop when I (SEE) Jane.

I was waiting at the bus stop when I saw Jane.

It (SNOW) when I (LEAVE) home this morning.



They (GO) to school when she (SLIP) on a banana.

I (READ) a book when the phone (RING).



Kim (STAND) when a frog (JUMP) into her mouth.

Mum (TAKE) a bath when we (COME) in.



We (PLAY) Hide-and-seek when I (STEP) on a snake.

Our teacher (RUN) when she (LOSE) her shoes.
