

The circulatory system.



...carry oxygen-rich blood away from the heart to your cells. They branch several times, becoming smaller and smaller.



...are small, thin, blood vessels that connect your arteries and your veins. Their thin walls allow oxygen and nutrients to enter your organs' cells.



you get them when the smallest veins or capillaries break and blood leaks out of them.



...take dirty blood back to your heart. They become larger and larger as they get closer to it.



...is located slightly to the left of your chest, under your ribs and between your lungs.



is a muscle that divides the left and right chambers
