

prefer, would rather, would prefer, had better

Had better + infinitive without to. I'd better **chop** the vegetables. I'd better **not go** there.

I prefer sth to sth else: I prefer the small chair **to** the big chair.

I prefer doing sth to doing sth else: I prefer **sailing to travelling** by plane.

I prefer to do sth rather than (do) sth else: I prefer **to play** the piano **rather than (play)** the guitar.

Would prefer + infinitive with to + (rather) than + infinitive without to/gerung:

We would prefer **to eat** in a restaurant (rather) than **eat/eating** at home.

Would rather + infinitive without to + (than + infinitive without to):

They would rather **take** the bus than **take** a taxi.

Would prefer + object + infinitive with to:

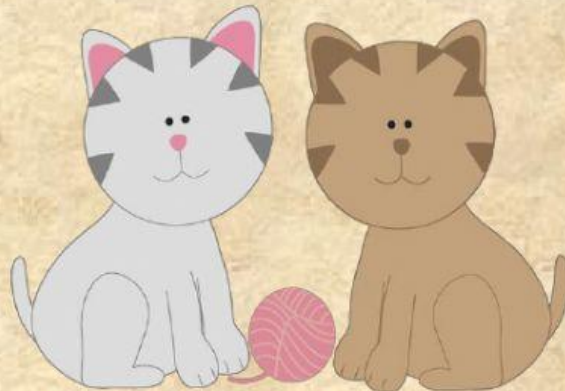
She would prefer **him** **to finish** the job.

Would rather + subject + past simple:

I would rather **he finished** the job.
