

# Inversion of Conditional

## I Conditional (Real Present: Possible & Probable)

Should + subj. + infinitive + will/may/can/should + infinitive OR imperative

~~If it rains~~, we'll stay indoors.

Should it rain, we'll stay indoors.

~~If you have finished~~ the book, give it to me.

Should you finish the book, give it to me.



## II Conditional (Unreal Present: Possible but Improbable)

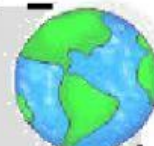
Were + subj. + (to - infinitive) + would/might/could + infinitive

~~If I were~~ you, I'd tell her the truth.

Were I you, I'd tell her the truth.

~~If I won~~ the lottery, I'd travel the world

Were I to win the lottery, I'd travel the world.



## III Conditional (Unreal Past: Impossible)

Had + Subj. + past participle + would/might/could + have + past participle

~~If he hadn't robbed~~ the bank, he wouldn't have gone to prison.

Had he not robbed the bank, he wouldn't have gone to prison

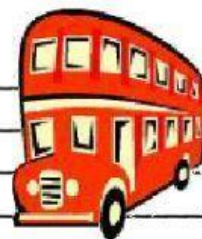
